Learning Outcomes

This course is a continuation of introductory course \$\Psi 4305\$ (Introduction to Clinical Assessment Skills). The completion of introductory course 4305 and the acquisition of basic knowledge / skills in psychological interviewing and assessment, allows for greater depth and wider scope of clinical assessment procedures.

At the end of this course, the students are expected to have a more complete overview of the assessment of different areas of primary and secondary school functionality (academic skills - cognitive skills - emotional status) beyond the assessment of their mental potential.
