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#### INTRODUCTION

I am a scientist and educator with an international research portfolio that bridges health, social, and applied psychology. My work is grounded in theory and driven by real-world impact. I specialise in health and risk behaviours across diverse populations—particularly young people—and have led and contributed to collaborative research on theory development to study health behaviours, behavioural intervention effectiveness evaluation, and structural influences on health. A key focus of mine is synthesizing health-related evidence. Another focus of mine is improving the quality and transparency of psychological research, especially through the creation of tools to appraise study quality. I advocate for transdisciplinary approaches to foster collaboration among academics, health-care professionals and stakeholders to best develop research that informs policy and practice. I also advocate for personalized health-care approaches and highlight potential downsides of adhering, uncritically, to blanket recommendations and guidelines that may be outdated or based on weak evidence. Currently, I am keenly interested in the impacts of hormonal changes in natural and chemically-induced menopause, and the optimal ways to support women in this transition. In the next pages, I present a snapshot of my academic journey, to date.
