### 2. LEARNING OUTCOMES

<b>Learning Outcomes</b>
<p>This laboratory course is a continuation of PSY 3208 and deepens students' familiarity with clinical assessment procedures. Beyond history taking, it incorporates the administration of psychometric scales assessing academic skills, cognitive abilities, and emotional functioning. Emphasis is placed on realistic clinical practice demands and on writing a full psychological report.</p> <p>Upon completion, students are expected to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Understand the requirements of a full clinical assessment</li> <li>• Organize, analyze, and interpret assessment data</li> <li>• Engage in data-based decision making</li> <li>• Write comprehensive psychological reports</li> <li>• Critically reflect on their own professional skills</li> </ul>

### 3. COURSE CONTENT

Week 4: Emotional assessment scales: Instructions for administration – Administration Modeling from the course tutor -Discussion [1]

Week 5: Review of clinical interview principles. Modifying the PSY.3208 history taking brochure to accommodate new sections of interviews & clinical testing [1,2,3,4]

Week 6: Preparation for the administration of psychometric scales (1). Administration practice through role-play in pairs & role switching [1].

Week 7: Preparation for the administration of psychometric scales (2). Administration practice through role-play in pairs & role switching [1].

Week 8: Preparation for the administration of psychometric scales (3). Administration practice through role-play in pairs & role switching. Instructions for processing data from the interviews / clinical assessment [1].

Week 9: Psychological report writing: Basic structure, sections & sub-sections

Week 10: Student data presentations and data interpretation (1) [1,2].

Week 11: Student data presentations and data interpretation (2) [1,2].

Week 12: Student data presentations and data interpretation (3) [1,2].

Week 13: Feedback, reflection on interview & clinical assessment procedures, course evaluation
